FAMILY EMPOWERMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Family Empowerment - income-based

The Family Empowerment Scholarship program is Florida's newest private education scholarship for low-income and some middle-income families. To learn more about program eligibility (Kindergarten students only), visit the Family Empowerment Scholarship program webpage.

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

A student enrolled in a Florida public school in kindergarten through grade 12 who has been subjected to an incident of battery; harassment; hazing; bullying; kidnapping; physical attack; robbery; sexual offenses, harassment, assault, or battery; threat or intimidation; or fighting at school the opportunity to transfer to another public school with capacity or enroll in an approved private school under the Hope Scholarship.

ALSO STILL ACCEPTING:

McKay, Gardiner, and Florida Tax Credit (FTC)

Being mindful of scholarships coming for budgetary reasons. Also being mindful of McKay scholarship students being enrolled. We have to review their ILP and the students have a trial week so that we can ensure we are able to meet their needs. Some students have more intensive needs and accommodations than we are able to meet. We need to make sure our students who are coming in will also keep the students we have safe.

The school is being more stringent about who is accepted. The families have to be accepting of the philosophies of the school. Accepting students and families who are really excited about being at this school. Assessments need to be done ahead of time. All students have a trial day and dependent on the reasons a student is applying, they may have a longer trial.

\$15,000 DONATION - NANCY AND RICK DILLEN

Unrestricted. \$6K used for professional financial audit. Brainstorming ideas and will take a community vote on how to spend the rest of the funds.

Third-party financial audit to help the school balance the budget in big-picture ways (where we can streamline). It would open us up to be able to have a <u>GuideStar</u> profile (on-line website for non-profits where people who want to make donations can find organizations they want to donate to).

Question: Will it cost \$6,000 annually for audit? Answer: I don't think so. Let's ask Ayana to be sure.

Possible investments:

<u>Market-Garden is</u> to also raise money for the school

Ms. Mikael will be helping us create the market garden and will help design the ways our students will develop the garden.

<u>Making renovations to the 1861 Highland house</u> so that it is more comfortable for the students. We will have to make special accommodations to meet ADA (breezeway between

buildings) and fire code requirements. Ways to create sound-insulation (cork boards on wall). Suggestions (shipping-code conversions, building up). Taking down some walls.

<u>Curb appeal branding</u>-painting the school houses the colors of our brand and make our place look more cohesive, new Verdi Ecoschool sign

Plant trees

Question: is the school going to accept more students?

Answer: At this point we are at capacity. We want to keep it small so that class sizes stay small and so that students still receive individualized plans. We will revisit together as school family to decide expansion/number of spaces available next school year.

FOOSANER CAMPS ON CLOSED WEEKS

As a hybridized year-round school, we are closed the entire month of June and Fourth of July week with four weeks of summer running as part of the school year. We spread out the extra weeks of vacation throughout the school-year rather than in the summer. Helps prevent the summer-slide. The schedule also helps educators with our project based learning so that educators can stay refreshed without teacher-burnout to keep quality courses and allow reflection.

The schedule can be challenging for parents working full-time. A potential solution is at Foosaner which is willing to run camps during our closed weeks. Price will be verified. They need at least five students in a four-year age span to run a camp. Same hours as our school day without after-care. We will have a link for sign-up with costs. This will be for future school breaks. Not affiliated with Verdi Ecoschool. It is completely run by the Foosaner. Not available for upcoming Sept 30 - Oct 4 break, but will be for other two mid-year breaks - February 3 - February 7 and May 11 - May 15.

Other camp suggestions: surf-camps, working parents take a day-off and rotate watching each other's children. School will help facilitate Foosaner camps during closure, but any others would be up to parents to organize.

Suggestion-using our large donation, getting a grant for the funds (not always feasible because of the time grants take to write).

Field trip logistics for drop-off and pick-up: Renting vans (Monica's van)

Monica's transportation drops-off and picks-up students. A service some of our families are using. Highly-recommended. Servicing areas around the school down south to Palm Bay. One way is \$40/week. You can contact Denise to get more information.
