GENETICS

How can we, as geneticists, learn about the traits of our DNA and their inheritance to connect all humans and improve our quality of life?

The week began with a review of DNA replication, transcription and translation. We dedicated the rest of the week to understanding cell division with an integrated teaching approach for them to apply the functions of these processes to genetics. In particular, making the connection of gene expression and variation to all of these cellular processes. We went in depth into the stages of mitosis and meiosis and what happens during each of the stages at the cellular level—(focusing on what is happening to the chromosomes). These concepts are the basis of understanding future lessons including the laws of heredity, mutations, forensics and all of the "more interesting" parts of genetics that everyone loves to learn. They showed

that they understood the importance of these critical concepts by working hard on all of the assignments this week.
