NI Recap	Come by and take a look at our self-identity panels hanging in the patio. The children have been working so hard over several weeks putting these together and they look fantastic! This week we continued working on our social-emotional intelligence with the Feeling Buddies curriculum. So far, we have met Happy, Scared, Angry, Sad, Calm and Disappointed. The children are learning to identify the various feelings and practicing how to self-regulate with them.
	We continued to have fun with /k/. We made a /k/ picture web where I was challenged to draw a Kangaroo! We explored making the letter K using different materials like sticks and playdough.
Toddlers	Ms. Sydney moved this past weekend and the toddlers took advantage of the extra cardboard boxes. We learned about different ways we could use cardboard boxes; such as houses, puzzles, rocket ships, and fine motor activities! We began the week panting pictures using (washable) paint and cardboard pieces. We talked about the different shapes and sizes of the cardboard, which also corresponded to the different cardboard shaped puzzles we had using farm animal pictures glued to cardboard. We also used a cardboard box to make a sensory box! The toddlers enjoyed decorating the box on the outside with cotton balls, pipe cleaners, feathers, coloring with crayons, and beautiful colored gems. We have a few strings hanging on the inside but plan on working more on it next week. We finished the week engaged in the cardboard box with different shapes cut out. We talked about shapes such as triangles, diamonds, squares, hearts and circles of different sizes, we explored what different objects would fit into each of them. We have learned many ways to make use of recyclables and extra tools in our environment. Next week we are excited to be making a sensory table using boxes, paper towel rolls, recyclable tools, and colorful rice. Looking forward to the new discoveries!
